

THE PRESENTERS

Rev. Canon Naim Ateek. Palestinian Anglican priest, founder/director of The Sabeel Ecumenical Liberation Theology Center in Jerusalem, Ateek lectures widely in Palestine and Israel as well as internationally. In addition to his books he has also published several articles for books and periodicals. Author of *Justice & Only Justice: A Palestinian Theology of Liberation*.

Phyllis Bennis. A fellow of the Institute for Policy Studies in Washington, focusing on Middle East and United Nations issues. She has written widely on Palestine, Iraq, and U.S. domination of the UN, including recent primers on Palestine and Iraq. In 2001 she helped found and currently co-chairs the U.S. Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation.

Joseph Carr. Activist with the International Solidarity Movement who witnessed the killing of Rachel Corrie, 23, an American volunteer at Rafah Refugee Camp in Gaza, by an Israeli military bulldozer in March 2003, and the shooting of British ISM activist Tom Hurndall as he attempted to protect Palestinian children from Israeli gunfire. A former volunteer for Amnesty International; attended Evergreen State College in Olympia, WA, in 2000-2002.

Ann Hafften. Journalist, author of *Water From the Rock: Lutheran Voices From Palestine*. Coordinator, Middle East Networking, Division for Global Mission, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Chicago.

Jeff Halper. Coordinator of The Israeli Committee Against House Demolitions in Jerusalem, a coalition of Israeli and Palestinian peace and human rights groups dedicated to resisting the occupation in all its forms and working together on a Global Campaign to Rebuild Palestinian Homes demolished by the Israeli military for Israeli settlements.

Tom Nelson. Attorney, co-founder of AUPHR and frequent participant in actions of the International Solidarity Movement, a Palestinian-led movement of Palestinian and International activists working to end the Israeli occupation utilizing nonviolent, direct-action methods of resistance. Member of National Lawyers Guild Delegation to Palestinian-Israeli Prisoners' Rights Organizations, Spring 2003; Portland Arab-Muslim Police Advisory Commission, 2002-03; Jewish-Arab-Muslim Dialogue Group (Portland 2002-03).

David Robinson. National Director of Pax Christi USA, the national Catholic peace movement; internationally recognized expert in the field of disarmament and nuclear deterrence who represents Pax Christi International on disarmament issues at the United Nations; a former member of the National Interreligious Service Board for Conscientious Objection (NISBCO), Executive Editor of *The Catholic Peace Voice*, a frequent traveler to the Middle East who has been arrested numerous times for acts of civil disobedience.

Jerome Sullivan FSC. Vice-President for Development at Bethlehem University, West Bank, from 1996-July 2003. Former Provincial of the De La Salle Brothers New York Province and former administrator of several Catholic schools in New York and New Jersey. BU is the only Catholic university in the Holy Land, operated by the De La Salle Christian Brothers, the largest employer in Bethlehem serving 2,000 Palestinian youth (69% Muslim, 31% Christian).

Donald Wagner. Executive Director of the Center for Middle Eastern Studies and Associate Professor of Religion and Middle Eastern Studies at Northpark University, Chicago. He is the author of *Anxious for Armageddon* and *Dying in the Land of Promise: Palestine and Palestinian Christianity from Pentecost to 2000*.

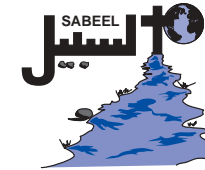
