November 12-19, 2008

Message from the Chair

Friends of Sabeel-North America exists solely to support the vision of Sabeel in Jerusalem, to promote that vision to Christians and their church leaders in the U.S. and Canada and to engage them in the hard work of justice and peace. It includes promotion for Sabeel's international conferences, such as the 7th International event highlighted above, and Sabeel's witness trips as well as distribution of their publications. Another part of our advocacy is financial support for Sabeel's offices in Jerusalem and Nazareth and their programs to support and

Troubled Past, Complex Future

Among those who struggle for justice and peace in Palestine, our focus has been the fight to end the illegal Occupation of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. However, in order to truly understand the complexities of memory, narrative, and identity faced by the Palestinian community, it is vital to examine the events of 1948—what the Palestinians refer to as the Nakba, or Catastrophe. For 60 years, the Nakba has cast its shadow over the struggles of identity and narrative undertaken both by Palestinian citizens of the state of Israel and those in the Occupied Territories. As the nonviolent resistance to Occupation continues, the question of what it means to be a Palestinian remains.

As Israel begins its celebration of 60 years

since independence, the Palestinian community will commemorate 60 years since the Nakba. During this important year, Sabeel believes that it is vital to examine the impact of 1948 on the quest for justice and peace in the Holy Land. It is only by examining and understanding the past that the Christian community—and, indeed, all people of this land—can begin to move towards a future of justice and reconciliation. For Palestinian Christians, and those Christians who are now citizens of the state of Israel, the question of identity becomes even more complex. As this community continues to address identity crisis, it also questions what resources within its past can enable it to construct a more just and hopeful future.

In addition to the question of identity, this conference provides an opportunity to address the ongoing refugee crisis which had its genesis in the Nakba. As Christians, we must face the challenge of finding a just resolution to the longest standing refugee crisis in the world today. This conference will provide an opportunity to hear directly from the refugees, and to explore options for a just and hopeful future for these Palestinians.

Sabeel believes that Christians are called to prophetically speak of justice and hope in the face of injustice and hopelessness. While memories of 1948 are often shocking and disturbing, the necessity of shining the light of justice and truth on the events of the past remains. By so doing, Sabeel hopes to forge a path from remembrance to justice and mercy and to challenge Christians and the global community to come to terms with 1948, to have a better understanding of the Palestinian Christian community inside the state of Israel, and to find a just solution to the refugee crisis.

The Questions

- What truly happened in 1948, and what did the Nakba mean for Palestinians?
- How have the events of 1948 shaped the complex identities of modern Palestinians and Israelis, and especially Christians living in the Occupied Palestinian Territories and Israel?
- Why has the refugee crisis remained unresolved for 60 years, and what can churches and the international community do to promote a just resolution of this situation?
- How will the events of 1948 continue to effect the quest for a just peace in Palestine and Israel?
- What do the events of 1948 reveal about injustice within Israel in addition to the injustice of the Occupation?
- How can those who seek justice for Palestinians as well as Israelis face the truth of 1948 while moving beyond memory to justice and reconciliation?

The Forum

These are some of the questions we will address at our Seventh International Conference. A roster of respected theologians, academics and activists from around the world will gather in Nazareth and Jerusalem in November 2008 to lead panel discussions, lectures, workshops, bible study and worship. Participants from many countries and a variety of faith denominations will have an unparalleled opportunity to learn, share insights, and work together.

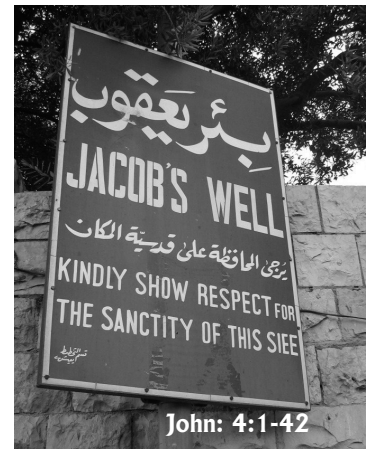

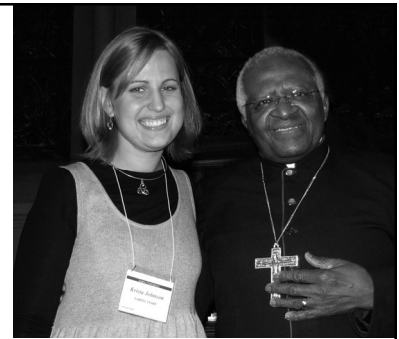

The Apartheid Paradigm in Palestine/Israel, a conference featuring Archbishop Desmond Tutu as keynote speaker, was the largest event in the U.S. to date. Almost 1,000 people filled the historic Old South Church while small groups opposed Sabeel's vision of justice in the Holy Land protested outside. Eventually we had to post a **SOLD OUT** sign on the front door as locals enticed by the controversy and curious to learn more, were turned away. Lots of excellent local media coverage, internet blogs and waves of emails going around the country continue to draw attention to Sabeel's work. Almost half of the attendees came from outside the state of Massachusetts, meaning it was truly a national event. We are so grateful to Bishop Tutu for his excellent presentations, which you may read on our website. You can order the complete conference in a set of 5 DVDs from www.arabic.hour.com. We have an 18-minute DVD with snippets from the conference available for free. FOSNA members received one by mail in our Christmas Appeal. 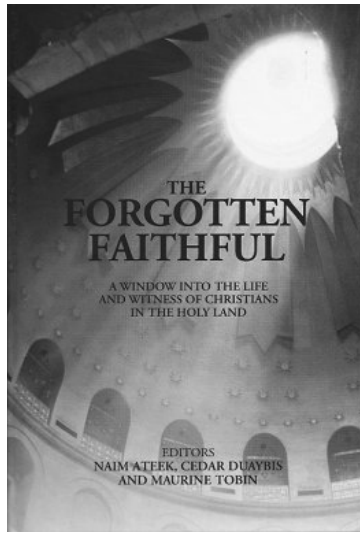

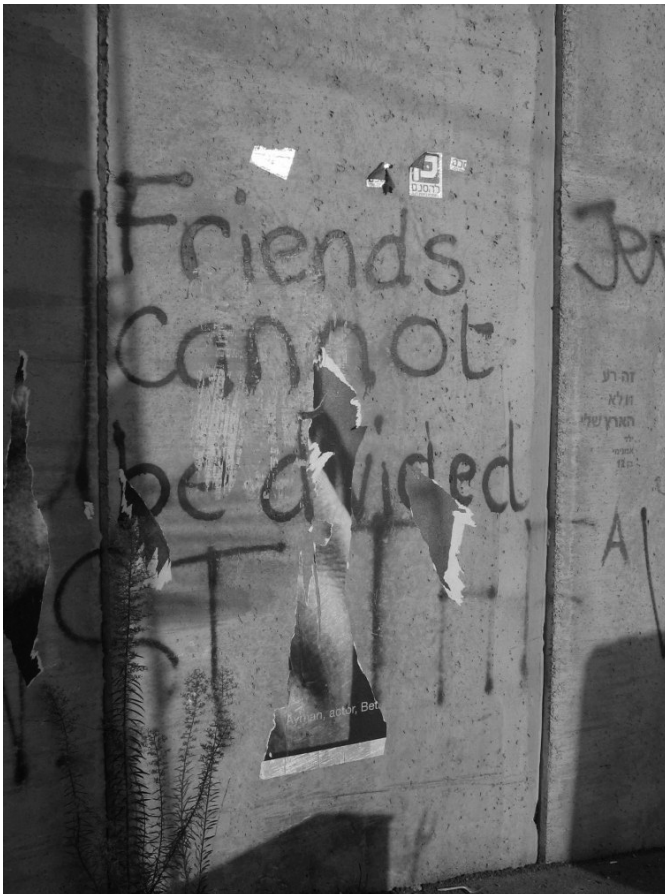

I became interested in the Israel-Palestine issue when my daughter, who was attending college, asked to bring some Palestinian students to our home. I was alarmed. My understanding of the Israel-Palestine conflict was as a tit-for-tat battle between almost equals. When I thought of Palestinians the next word in my head was "terrorist". But I chose to trust my daughter and it turned out that meeting and establishing a relationship with these Palestinian students came to be one of the big bonuses in our family's life. They were delightful, interesting, bright, and very broadly informed young people. For about seven years they were in and out of our home, sharing Thanksgiving, Christmas, fishing trips, picnics, a camping trip, and many, many cups of tea.

As a victim of violence myself, I understand the difficult-to-heal soul-rage, numbing, and pervasive hopelessness created when children experience long-term violence and domination. I see violence itself as an enemy which poisons our future, so I was very concerned to hear these Palestinian students' stories of Israeli brutality against the entire Palestinian society, mostly civilians and children. One student told us how as a child, his family had been forced to move again and again, each time because Israel had demolished their home. Another student told us of middle-of-the-night raids when the Israeli military would break into their home, beating and jailing selected family members. He had been beaten, tortured and had spent nearly three years in Israeli prisons yet had never been charged with anything. These and other stories were difficult for me to believe, so I verified them through human rights, United Nations, and Israeli newspaper websites. My involvement might have ended there had it not been for 9-11. As I sat in front of my TV that morning of 9-11, I could not help but think that some of the rage behind such an attack had to be about our government's long history of supporting and financing Israel's occupation and take-over of Palestinian territory and other neighbors' territory in the Middle East.

I began to look for groups working on this issue and by chance came across a Conference in Boston in April 2002 during the same week I would be visiting family in Boston. It turned out to be the first Sabeel Conference. Relieved and inspired by the speakers I heard at that conference, including Bishop Desmond Tutu and the Rev. Cannon Niam Ateek, I returned to Utah determined to be locally involved in the Israel-Palestine issue, with the long term dream of one day hosting a Sabeel Conference in Utah. As it turned out, I and two other individuals founded a nonprofit grassroots group in Utah, *Utahns for a Just Peace in the Holy Land*, and we did host a Sabeel Conference in Utah in February, 2004. Our group continues to work on this issue, bringing speakers to Utah, giving talks, writing letters and op-eds to local newspapers, visiting congressmen, etc.

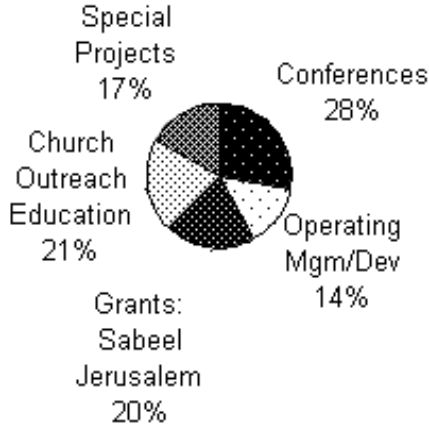
