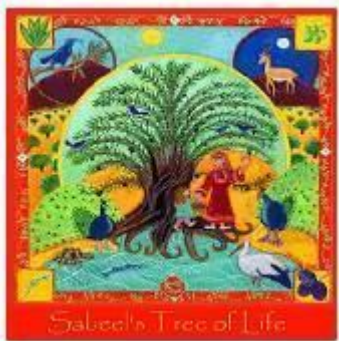

What is Sabeel? Sabeel is a grassroots, international, interfaith peace movement founded by Christian Palestinians in Jerusalem. Sabeel is Arabic for “the way”. The vision is to create a just peace based on spiritual, moral, and legal principles.

The purpose of the conference is to promote a deeper understanding of the Palestinian-Israeli conflict. Come to hear secular and religious leaders, journalists, and writers. The way forward is through non-violence and education.
